## **KEYS & REMOTES**

### **Programming instructions for KF150**

*Key blade requires cutting  
by your local locksmith.*



#### **Programming in a 3<sup>rd</sup> (or more) key:**

1. Insert Old Key 'A' into the ignition and turn to the 'I' (Acc) position.
2. Turn Old Key 'A' to the 'O' (Off) position and remove key.
3. Inset Old Key 'B' and turn to the 'II' (On) position.
4. Turn Old Key 'B' to the 'O' (Off) position and remove. The Door locks will sequence.
5. Inset the new key and turn to the 'II' (On) position. If performed correctly, the door locks will sequence 3 times to show successful programming.
6. Turn the new key to the 'O' (Off) position and remove from the ignition.

#### **Programming in a first or second key:**

1. *Important Note: At least two keys have to programmed to the vehicle.*
2. *Programming needs to be done via a compatible scan tool.*

## Programming Remote Control:

**All remote controls must be present during the below process. Any old remote controls that are not present will no longer function.**

1. Ensure all doors + boot is closed.
2. Sit in driver's seat (with door closed)
3. Insert key into the ignition and turn to the 'I' (Accessories) position.
4. Press the rear demister button 3 times within 4 seconds – if performed correctly, the door locks will sequence. You are now in learn mode.
5. Press the lock button on the new remote.
6. Press the lock button on any old remote controls.
7. Once you have finished programming, turn the key to the '0' (Off) position and remove the key.

### Tips:

4. Alternatively, try pressing the rear demister button 3 times rapidly.



**WARNING!** This remote control contains a button/coin cell battery. It is a lithium button/coin cell battery.
